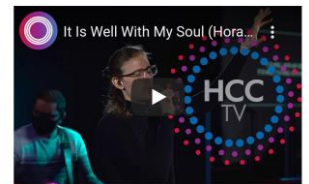
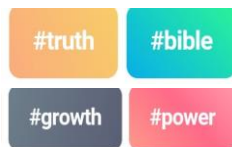


Tips for creating a good devotional plan

- Have a set **theme** or idea in mind before starting. Make use of the **tags** on the Plan Information to help your plan get discovered. We recommend using 3-5.
- Create a really **eye catching cover image** to get people's attention on the Discover page. Include between **3 and 10 days** in your devotional for a good length that isn't too short or long.
- Make use of **titles** for each day and use **headers** to help add structure to your days. Try to include **some images, GIFs or videos** to add a visual element to the plan.



- Keep the **structure of the days similar** throughout the plan and aim to keep them between 5 and 10 minutes in length. Use a Word Processor (e.g. Microsoft Word) to help with **good grammar/spelling**.
- Try to support each day with a **short Bible passage**. This could be either written or in the form of a video. Add **Reflections** or **Challenges** to help people go further.
- Don't mention **specific names** of people or churches/organisations without context (especially if you want your plan to be verified for wider consumption)
- Have fun and be **creative!**
